

REMEMBER ON COLLECTION DAY

- 1 The carts should be placed at the curbside no later than 6:30 am on collection day and removed from the curbside within 12 hours after service.
- 2 The carts should be placed with the handles and wheels facing towards your home.
- 3 Place carts side-by-side approximately 1 foot apart & at least 3 feet from any obstruction (i. e. vehicles, fire hydrants, trees).
- 4 Items placed outside of carts will not be collected. Cart lids should be closed. Please do not overload.

TEMPORARY COLLECTIONS

Larger waste collection containers (from 3 yards to 40 yards) are available for clean-up projects and other disposal needs. For additional pricing details or to arrange for a delivery of a larger container to your residence or business, please call CR&R Customer Service.



BULKY ITEMS

Items that cannot fit in your automated carts are considered bulky items. Bulky items must be manageable by a two-person crew.

EXAMPLES OF BULKY ITEMS INCLUDE:

- Couches
- Tables
- Desks
- Mattresses
- Chairs
- Excess Green Waste

Each residential customer is entitled to [3] bulky item pick-ups free-of-charge per calendar year. A bulky item service may include a combination of large items or bags of material. Additional picks-ups may be arranged for a nominal charge.

NEW RESIDENTS: If you are a new resident you may use your bulky item service to collect all of your paper, cardboard and packing material.

WHITE GOODS HOUSEHOLD APPLIANCES

White Goods, or household appliances containing Freon are picked up similar to a bulky item. Refrigerators contain Freon and other chemicals that require special handling. CR&R will collect bulky items and white goods from your curbside.

E-WASTE

Electronic Waste (e-waste) is anything with a circuit board or battery. It is illegal to dispose of e-waste in any of your automated carts. CR&R will collect and legally dispose of and recycle these items.

EXAMPLES OF E-WASTE INCLUDE:

- Monitors
- Televisions
- Cell Phones
- Printers
- Computers

SHARPS

Needles, lancets and other home-generated sharps may be collected in an approved puncture proof container and recycled through the local pharmacies. For more information about the City of Laguna Niguel sharps drop-off program visit: www.cityoflagunaniguel.org/sharps or call 949.362.4384.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

Household Hazardous Wastes (HHW) are products that are flammable, corrosive, reactive or toxic. They are dangerous to the public and the environment.


EXAMPLES OF HHW INCLUDE:

- Fluorescent Light Tubes
- Household Batteries
- Non empty Aerosol Cans
- Thermostats
- High Intensity Discharge Lamps

Collection of these items is included in your service.

You may call CR&R Customer Service and make arrangements for a special door side collection of HHW items. The Customer Service Representative will ask you for a specific number and list of items. This is required by law in order to collect the material. Please be prepared with this information.

New Year's Day	Labor Day
Memorial Day	Thanksgiving Day

If the holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday, trash will be collected on your normal collection day with no delays to your pickup. If the holiday falls during the work week, collection for the remainder of the week may be delayed by one day. For example, if Independence Day falls on a Monday, and your normal collection day is on a Thursday, your pickup for that week will be on Friday.

Compostable bags are optional and available at local retailers. Other types of plastic bags are not accepted.

You may also line your cart with newspaper or paper bags.

Your organics will be converted into renewable natural gas as well as anaerobic compost.
