



Recycling Requirements for Commercial Businesses

Per Senate Bill (SB) 1383 Section 18984.10 and Laguna Niguel Municipal Code (LNMC) Section 6-3-702, generators that are commercial businesses are responsible for all the following. Per SB 1383 and LNMC, commercial businesses include multi-family residential dwellings.

COLLECTION & CONTAINERS

<p>✓</p> <p>Subscribe to and participate in hauler's 3-container program for trash, recycling, and food scrap recycling,</p> <p>OR</p> <p>Self-haul recyclables, food scraps, and landscaping waste to a recycling center, or composting facility.</p>	<p>✓</p> <p>Supply and allow access to an adequate number, size, and location of recycling and food scrap recycling for all employees, contractors, and tenants.</p>	<p>✓</p> <p>Place recycling and food scrap recycling bins next to all trash bins provided for customer use, with appropriate signage indicating which items belong in each container. See example below. Excludes multi-family properties.</p>

EDUCATION & INSPECTION

- ✓ Inspect trash, recycling, and food scrap recycling containers for contamination periodically and inform employees if containers are contaminated.
- ✓ Instruct employees how to properly sort material into the correct trash, recycling, and food scrap recycling containers.
- ✓ Annually educate employees, contractors, tenants, and customers about SB 1383 recycling requirements and about proper sorting of recyclable and food scrap material.



Example of customer-facing containers

If you are a **property manager** or **landlord**, you must annually provide SB 1383 education to all tenants on how to properly sort recyclables and food scraps into the correct bins. Property management must provide new tenants with information about their SB 1383 requirements to sort waste properly within 14 days of occupation.
